# Fire Safety

**Grade level:** Kindergarten & First

**Submitted By:** Mrs. Merrimon

**Content:** Teaching fire safety, facts about fire, the dangers involved and how to be safe

**Materials:** Book *FIRE* by David Bennett, smoke alarm and a telephone

**Goals:**

1. The children will know why it is important to identify fire hazards
2. The children will develop a home fire safety drill with their parents
3. The children will know what to do if they hear a smoke alarm sound

**Objectives:**

1. The children will identify fire hazards in a home
2. The children will learn to Stop, Drop, and Roll
3. The children will learn to dial 911

**Introduction:**

1. Begin with a brief discussion of fire safety
2. Display a fire fighter poster
3. Display materials

**Development:**

1. Actually sound a real smoke alarm found in a house
2. Teacher shows a panic reaction
3. Teacher demonstrates a calm reaction

**Practice:**

1. Ask which reaction was the best choice to carry out
2. Show book, discuss cover, and picture walk through with group
3. Model the story aloud during reading

**Independent Practice:**

1. Each child will practice the Stop, Drop, and roll procedure
2. Each child will crawl low with a blindfold on: crawl through an obstacle course emulating smoke in the air and having to escape
3. Each child will practice dialing 911 on the telephone

**Accommodations:**

1. Model a 911 emergency phone call
2. Monitor children's responses during the reading of the book to assess how well they understand the story.
3. Children with visual or movement issues sit by teacher

**Checking For Understanding:**

1. Questioning
2. Eye Contact
3. Prior knowledge vs. Post knowledge after lesson

**Closure:**

1. Revisit the lesson and touch main points
2. Demonstrate how to make a firefighters hat. Use a sentence strip and a pattern to create and represent a firefighter hat.
